- 2. No exhibitor to have more than one entry in any one class.
- The entry form must be filled in & sent to either Mrs J. Powell, 4 Copnor or Jean Partridge, 1 Heath End with entrance money, 20p per exhibit, by 8pm Saturday 12th August 2023. Any entry accepted by the Secretary after this date will be charged 50p per entry.

No entries will be accepted after Wednesday 16th August.

- 4. Exhibits may be brought to the show from 8am on the day of the show and must be staged by 10.45am when the hall will be cleared for judging. Exhibits may also be staged on Friday 18th August from 7.30pm to 9.00pm.
- 5. The committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to any exhibit during the show but all ordinary care will be taken of them
- 6 All points in dispute must be submitted to the committee before 4pm on the day of the show.
- 7. Exhibits must not be removed until after 4pm.
- 8. No article to be entered that has previously been shown.
- 9. All exhibits to be strictly to size where stated.
- 10. Cups will be presented after 3pm
- 11. Prize money to be collected AFTER 3:30pm and BEFORE 5:00pm at the village hall. Prize money not collected will be put into show funds.
- 12. All exhibitors must provide own vases.

SEMI-RICH FRUIT CAKE

Ingredients

5oz Margarine 5oz Caster sugar 2 Eggs, standard, beaten

12oz mixed Fruit

8oz Self-raising Flour & 1 level tsp mixed spice, sieved together ½ pt milk minus 2 tablespoons

METHOD

- 1. Preheat oven to 300 °F / 150 °C / Gas 2
 Prepare a deep 7in tin by lining with baking paper.
- 2. Place all ingredients together in mixing bowl, beat with wooden spoon until well mixed (2 3 minutes)
- 3. Place in prepared tin, smooth top with back of wet spoon.
- 4. Bake in pre-heated oven for $1\frac{3}{4}$ $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours.
- Test before removing from the oven with a warm skewer in middle of cake. If cake is done skewer will come out clean.
- Leave to cool in tin for 5 minutes. Turn out, remove paper and cool on wire rack.

HONEY CAKE

<u>Ingredients</u>

METHOD

- Preheat the oven to 180 °C/350 °F Gas Mark 4.
- Prepare a well buttered 7" circular tin
- Cream the Butter and Honey together.
- Beat eggs well and add alternately with sifted flour and salt (save a little flour to add with the sultanas)
- Beat well and lightly, if required add a little milk
- Turn in the sultanas and stir well
- Bake in the oven for 1 hour 15 minutes
