4. Exhibits may be brought to the show from 8am on the day of the show and must be staged by 10.45am when the hall will be cleared for judging. Exhibits may also be staged on Friday $16^{\text {th }}$ August from 7.30pm to 9.00pm.
5. The committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to any exhibit during the show but all ordinary care will be taken of them.

6 All points in dispute must be submitted to the committee before 4 pm on the day of the show.
7. Exhibits must not be removed until after 4 pm .
8. No article to be entered that has previously been shown.
9. All exhibits to be strictly to size where stated.
10. Cups will be presented after 3 pm
11. Prize money to be collected AFTER 3:30pm and BEFORE 5:00pm at the village hall. Prize money not collected will be put into show funds.

## SEMI-RICH FRUIT CAKE

Ingredients
5oz Margarine
$50 z$ Caster sugar
2 Eggs, standard, beaten
$120 z$ mixed Fruit
8oz Self-raising Flour \& 1 level tsp mixed spice, sieved together
$1 / 4$ pt milk minus 2 tablespoons

## METHOD

1. Preheat oven to $300^{\circ} \mathrm{F} / 150^{\circ} \mathrm{C} /$ Gas 2

Prepare a deep 7in tin by lining with baking paper.
2. Place all ingredients together in mixing bowl, beat with wooden spoon until well mixed ( $2-3$ minutes)
3. Place in prepared tin, smooth top with back of wet spoon.
4. Bake in pre-heated oven for $13 / 4-21 / 2$ hours.
5. Test before removing from the oven with a warm skewer in middle of cake. If cake is done skewer will come out clean.
6. Leave to cool in tin for 5 minutes. Turn out, remove paper and cool on wire rack.
